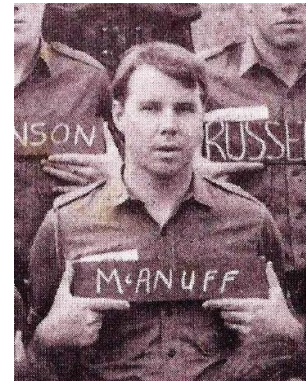


Kevin Thomas James McAnuff was born in Subiaco, WA, on 3 November 1945 to Helena (nee McKenna) and Hector McAnuff. He completed his Secondary Education in Aquinas College, Perth. He graduated from Curtin University School of Pharmacy in 1969 and the WA Institute of Technology, as an Associate in Pharmacy in 1970. When called up for National Service Kevin was employed as a Relieving Pharmacist. On 19 April 1972, Kevin commenced his NS with the second intake for 1972 as 5719213 at 2 RTB, Puckapunyal. He was selected for Officer Training and commenced at OTU, Scheyville, on 5 May 72. Kevin was allocated to 14 Section, 7 Platoon, Blamey Company in Room 21 in Hut C1, just beside the Parade Ground. His "Father" was Peter Ray. In his Senior Term he remained in 7 Platoon. His 'Son' was Officer Cadet Crimmins, who had transferred from NS to the OCS Course, but did not graduate.



Kevin graduated with his class, 2/72, on 5 October 1972, was allocated to the RAAMC and posted to No. 2 Base Medical and Dental Equipment Depot (Pharmacy). Given the option to discharge after the election of the Labor government on 2 December 1972, Kevin took discharge and returned to Pharmacy.



Kevin married Patricia and in the 1980s ran a Community Pharmacy at Shenton Park, an inner western suburb of Perth. 1985 saw Kevin elected to the Pharmaceutical Council of WA, where he was a member for 19 years including 12 years as President from 1991. In 1991 Kevin had moved to the Brentwood Pharmacy, in Brentwood, a southern suburb of Perth. In January 2004, Kevin travelled to Canberra, on Pharmacy Guild business, where unfortunately, on 18 January, he died. Kevin's body was returned to Perth where his funeral was held at his former school, Aquinas College, set in verdant flora with tall silver gum trees in Manning, a near-south suburb of Perth, overlooking the Canning River. Almost 1,000 people attended the service, which provided a moving tribute to

Kevin's pharmacy career and family life.
