Research into Australian and British Commonwealth Military History can be undertaken. For Australian service personnel, the standard charge for a report to providing all biographical, service, medals, battles, etc details is \$50. Rates for other research can be advised on request. Most tasks can be completed within two weeks.

Mostly Unsung continues to locate and develop new resources for researching military history. Recent examples include White Russian Awards World War One; French Medaille Militaire recipients World War One; Infantry Group roll for the Australian Parliament House opening 1927; 34<sup>th</sup> Australian Works Company records World War Two, honour roll for the airborne landings at Arnhem and the General Service Medal clasp S. E. Asia 1945-46 medal rolls.

Our Boer War holdings are still without equal and include computerised medal and clasp entitlements for Australian Contingents to the Boer War 1899-1902 (with 1000 more than listed in *Murray's*); plus all medal rolls and service papers for most Irregular units, etc.

**Neil and Sylvie Smith will again be researching at The National Archives, the National Army Museum, London Metropolitan Archives and Imperial War Museum in London in August 2020. Your research tasks are welcome.**

## RESEARCHER'S NOTICEBOARD

Nominal rolls are notorious for being incomplete or inaccurate. Certainly, at Mostly Unsung, it seems to be a never-ending task to compile or correct nominal rolls for all periods of Australia's rich military heritage. The advent of a paperless environment promises to exacerbate the problem. For instance, gone are the days of embarkation rolls being carefully compiled as men embark for overseas. But we must continue to work towards improving all such information if real recognition of individual service is desired. A case in point is the Vietnam Nominal Roll. Publicly available records reveal that the following men served in that conflict but are not included on the official roll:
